When I came, she was brilliant at looking after me and helping me make the adjustment from a small school in Shropshire where just two languages were spoken, to a large multi-ethnic school with 39 languages! We have made a really good team and between us expanded and grown the leadership team into a confident, multi-skilled unit that really can drive forward all the improvements we have made over the last 7 years. What Christine has brought to that has been the ability to reach all the members of the school staffing and ensure that their voice is heard in the leadership team meetings and in forward planning. As a teacher she has few equals here and as a day-to-day manager and "keeper of things on an even keel" she has been outstanding. Trying to replace her will be impossible and I will cherish everything she has brought to this school as teacher, leader and musician. She will take up her new post as headteacher of Steeple Claydon Primary School in September and will undoubtedly lead that school to greater strengths. All of us wish her everything of the very best for a great future.
