Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is specific, additional funding provided to support the education of pupils eligible for:

- free school meals (FSM),
- pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (Ever6),
- children who have been looked after continuously for a period of six months and
- children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

There is a clear expectation that it will be used to close the gap for pupils living in poverty. In 2017-2018 each pupil with Ever6 FSM in primary will receive £1,320, LAC £1,900 and service children £300. It includes children adopted from care or who have left care (post LAC).

All Looked After Children are entitled to Pupil Premium. The 'Virtual School' provides a set amount (£1,900); however we are able to apply for further funding if a child needs more intensive support than this would allow for.

Children registered for FSM are entitled to a daily meal currently £2.30 but would not have to take it for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding. Entitlement to claim FSM if parents are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Job Seekers Allowance (income based) or Income Support
- Child Tax Credit (not working Tax Credit) provided the annual income assessed by the Inland Revenue does not exceed £16,190 (this amount is subject to change in April)
- Employment Support Allowance (income related)
- Guarantee Element of Pension Tax Credit
- Universal Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support (NASS)
