Science

Food webs

Before we start, what can you remember about food chains? How does a food chain show the feeding relationships between different organisms? Think about the words predator, prey, producer and consumer in your answer.

Today we are thinking all about food webs... A food web is a collection of food chains

Some important food web vocabulary:

Decomposer-

- a decomposer is the bottom level of a food chain or web. Decomposers are organisms that break down dead plants and animals, thus releasing their nutrients. They are crucial because without these nutrient being released the soil would not be as fertile; therefore plants would not grow as well

Producers-

- producers are the next level in a food chain or web. Producers make their own food and use the nutrients released by the decomposers. Green plants are producers and use sunlight, carbon dioxide and water to make their own food.

Primary consumers-

- primary consumers are the next level in a food chain or web. Primary consumers eat plants

Secondary consumers-

- secondary consumers are the next level in a food chain or web. Secondary consumers eat other animals

Remember... the arrows on a food chain/web show the direction the energy passes.
