A suffix is a string of letters that go at the end of a **root word**, changing or adding to its meaning.

Suffix	Meaning	Example	In a sentence
-ful	full of	help <u>ful</u>	
-est	the most (superlative adjective)	great <u>est</u>	
-ing	doing now	work <u>ing</u>	
-less	without	hope <u>less</u>	
-ly	how something was done (adverb)	quiet <u>ly</u>	
-er	more than (comparative adjective)	tall <u>er</u>	
-er	someone's job or responsibility	driver
